It is often said that every inch of ground in Westminster is steeped in history. This has just been given a fresh and striking corrobation by an interesting find made during excavations beneath the Houses of Parl:ament The Ministry of Work onnounced recently that ninth century sword of fine workmanship had been discovered about 30 feet below the ground The place where It was found would formerly have been part of the bed of the River Thumes. Experts consider that it will make a notable addition to archaeologists' knowledge of the Savon period in Britain. "Despite" the fact it must have lain beneath the river for close on ten centuries, the weapon is complete except for a small part of the grip and pommel. The length of the sword is two feet nine-and-a-half inches.
