Obituary

JOHN THOMAS DAVIDSON
Well known Western Pioneer, John Thomas Davidson passed away at Guelph General Hospital on Sunday, April 10, 1949. Mr. Davidson was born on December 21, 1879, on the old farm north of Acton, the son of the late Charles and Margaret Davidson.

He began working for the Grand Trunk Railway in Acton about 1898 and in 1903 was married to Agnes Anderson. In 1902 they went West and he opened many of the stations in the small towns that were springing up at that time. For this purpose they were provided with a special car with their household effects in it, which was used until a station could be built and an agent appointed, when they then left to repeat the same service at another point.

In the year 1915 he left the employ of the Canadian National Railway and joined the Dominion Government Telegraph Service in which capacity he remained until 1940 when he retired.

During this time Mr. Davidson delivered many a message of joy and sorrow to the ranchers and homesteaders of Northern Saskatchewan and Alberta and his passing will be sincerely regretted by these old timers of the trail and pioneer districts.

Mr. Davidson became interested in Amateur Short Wave in 1928, and held his license to operate and broadcast continuously since that date. He was very enthusiastic about this and took great delight in sending personal messages to foreign climes for the people who had friends or relatives there or just chatting on the air to a ship operator at sea, weather station in Alaska, and on rare occasions to some American or British operator in Moscow, Tokyo, South Africa, Australia and many others too numerous to mention. During the war these operations had to be discontinued and it was with much regret he closed down for that period. He went back to work in 1942 at the Research Enterprises Ltd., Leaside, Toronto, until the war finished. While there he won several prizes for suggestions on improvements of Radio Equipment.

Survivors include his widow, the former Agnes Anderson and three children all born out west, Mrs. Hudson, of Jasper Alberta, Mrs. Arnold of Glenbush Saskatchewan, and Charles Davidson of Rockwood, Ontario, six grandchildren and one brother Robert Davidson on the 3rd line.

Interment was held at Fairview Cemetery, Acton, Ontario, on Wednesday, April 6th, 1949. The Rev. Armstrong, Knox Presbyterian Church and Walker Lodge A.F. & A.M. officiated at the funeral service.

Mr. Davidson was a member of the Acton Rotary Club and the Acton Industrial Association. He was a very kind and generous man and his passing is a great loss to the community.
