## PROGRESS ON ACE ELECTRONIC BRAIN

The latest techniques in the development of the Ace, the British Electronic "Brain", were shown to the public recently at the National Physical Laboratory at Teddington. This high-speed computing machine is claimed to be 1,000 times faster than any other calculating machine yet constructed. It contains numbers up to thousands of millions represented as a sequence of powers of two. The digits are translated into electrical pulses about one third of one-millionth of a second in length and about one-millionth of a second apart.


The Empire Day program sponsored by the pupils of the Milton Public School in the Princess Theatre on Wednesday, May 29th was greatly enjoyed by all who attended.

## GASOLINE FOR OVERSEAS TRAVELING PUR OVERSEAS

Britain's Ministry of Fuel and Power announces that as from June 1, 1948, special allowances of gasoline coupons for up to 250 miles motoring will be provided for overseas visitors who hold a Commonwealth or foreign passport and who, during their stay, borrow a private motor vehicle (free of charge) or purchase one second-hand. The overseas visitor must have entered the United Kingdom not more than six months before the date on which application is made. Only one allowance under this scheme will be issued to a visitor in respect of any one stay in Britain or during any period of six months.
