# Georgetown Enters North Halton High School District

(Continued from Page One)

duplicates before they had been checked and found correct.

Defending the actions of his municipality, Reeve T. Jones explained, "When we found out what the fire hazards were in this office, we felt we should keep these valuable cards until duplicates were made."

Reeve VanSickle concurred adding he believed Acton's actions were very sound in trying to preserve their work, and added the county should take immediate steps to afford greater protection of these cards as they represented two years work.

The Warden explained that as soon as the Assessor was able to move his office to the vacant rooms in the Court House, this difficulty would be remedied.

The Warden announced that Thursday was the day on which Halton and Peel councils were entertaining the Simcoe County Council and asked all members to be present. Roy Smith outlined the program for the day. The three groups of municipal bodies are to meet in Brampton, and be taken on a tour of the southern portion of Halton County, visiting General Electric plant at Oakville. After luncheon at Burlington the group will go to the Jet plane plant at Milton, then visit the Bull farm at Brampton, after which dinner will be served at Bolton.

Council ordered a letter from the Royal Bank at Georgetown, to be filed. The bank were seeking to have some of the woodlot literature distributed to farmers along with county information which will be available later.

A by-law setting down the equalized assessment for the different municipalities for '50 was approved. The clerk announced there was no change this year. The assessment for county purposes will be: Acton, \$1,294,340.00; Burlington, \$2,817,474.00; Georgetown, \$1,615,830.00; Milton, \$1,488,628.00; Oakville, \$3,491,846.00; Esquesing, \$5,257,368.00; Nassagaweya, \$2,140,902.00; Nelson, \$5,259,487.00; Trafalgar, \$8,588,827.00.

Council approved of the Building Committee's recommendations that V. Hall, caretaker salary be increased \$100 a year. Mr. Chambers said he was the only employee who had not received an increase this year. The board fence is to be repaired and moved back making the jail yard smaller but would be in line with other buildings. Labour will be done by inmates of the jail. The contract to decorate three rooms in the County Buildings was awarded to McLeod and Frank for the sum of \$267.

Reeve John T. Armstrong was chosen as the council's delegate to attend the annual meeting of Halton Municipal Association.

Deputations from Milton, Esquesing and Acton Fairs were presented seeking their usual grants from Council. Each of the members, E. M. Headhead, Craig Reid and Mr. Swackhamer stated their fairs were showing an increase in prize money being spent along with increased entries last year. Council granted the Halton Agricultural Society \$300 and the Acton Fair and Esquesing Fair \$200 each.

Accounts approved and ordered to be paid were: County Roads, \$17,240.71; County Buildings, \$1,068.05; Hospital Accounts, \$1,372.45; Agriculture and Reforestation \$402.31; Educational, \$87.00; Printing, \$517.22; Finance, \$3,002.36; Assessment, \$89.45.

Council adjourned to meet July 12th.
