

To the Electors of Halton:

As we move into the final day of the election campaign we find that our Prime Minister, the Rt. Hon. Louis St. Laurent is continuing to explain to the electors in a courtly manner what forty days hopes to accomplish for us all.

The most important thing of all is full employment. No nation can be really prosperous without a high volume of production.

The wealth of a nation is its production.

The next important factor is a satisfied public service for all.

When our production in Canada is at a high level we have to export about one third of our total production.

We have to exchange our surplus for the goods of other nations which we require.

The Liberal party has always fostered foreign trade by low tariffs and by reciprocal trade agreements.

While it is true that the Conservative party has more recently adopted our policy of protectionism, we did so in the past. The first political campaign in which I took any survey was in 1911 and I well remember the slogan of the Conservative party of that day which was "No trade with the United States".

The Conservative party won that campaign in their opposition to trade reciprocity with the United States. They now see their mistake and in the present situation they advocate reciprocal trade agreements.

Other nations too will not be forgotten of the past attitude of previous Tory governments and it is for you to decide as to whether the newly elected Conservative party will be able to negotiate the best trade agreements for Canada.

With high employment a good domestic market is assured and with the Liberal party in office just now we have to depend on the best foreign markets which are available.

It is true that the upset condition of the world today has created foreign exchange problems which hamper trade. Canada has not created these problems.

On the contrary she has done her full part to help cure them. Some think that our aid to help the recovery of Britain has been too generous. I do not agree with this contention. In the first place by helping Britain we are creating markets for our goods and in the second place the sacrifices made by Britain saved the world from Hitler.

The third important factor for a prosperous Canada is that the type of prosperity which Liberalism seeks is that our prosperity should be shared with reasonable equality by all classes by labour, by agriculture, by industry. Your Liberal government has achieved this result. By our policy of taxation we have prevented any mass accumulation of wealth in the hands of a few people. Our taxation policy is a contribution to a Conservative two fold aim. Liberalism stands for the welfare of the masses and is wholly opposed to the Big Interests.

While our Liberal Prime Minister is carrying on a sane and thoughtful campaign, the other candidates in this riding are rather confused. The Newfoundland and the Nova Scotia provincial election have gone heavily Liberal. Perhaps the Juno Islanders have been recently influenced by the fact that the Liberal candidate in the Newfoundland election, Mr. John Diefenbaker, has been elected. However, the Nova Scotians have voted Liberal in the recent election. The Liberal candidate in the Nova Scotia election, Mr. H. L. MacLellan, has been elected. This is a good omen for the future.

Mr. Diefenbaker, in his speech at the opening of the Canadian Parliament, said that he would have no difficulty in getting a Canadian majority in the Canadian Parliament if the Liberal platform is taken on the other foot.

about  
TRAVEL RATION  
REGULATIONS?**

It saves time and trouble when you familiarize yourself with the regulations regarding travel to the United States before you set out on your trip. Here are the facts.

1. The allowance for pleasure travel during the current ration period of November 16th, 1948, to November 18th, 1949, is \$150 U.S. per person (\$100 in the case of children under 11 years old).

2. A Form H permit, obtainable at any bank, is required to take out of Canada amounts exceeding \$10 U.S. or \$25 U.S. and Canadian funds.

3. Special allowances are granted for strictly business travel where your application is certified by your employer.

4. Applications for larger amounts of U.S. funds for travel for health or educational purposes may be made on special forms obtainable at your bank.
