burdened. Acton was in favor of the central school plan as originally agreed upon.

Mayor Gibbons, of Georgetown, stated that the main reason for Georgetown's late entry in the district was the opposition to the Speyside site.

From here on there were several speakers in a question and answer period with opportunity for various views to be expressed.

These speakers included G. A. Dills, Col. G. O. Brown, Inspector Stewart, Inspector Lake, Deputy Reeve Tyler, Mr. Lever, auditor, Mr. Beaumont and Mr. W. Blehn...

Three starts were made on a resolution (There was no secretary of the meeting and no written resolutions presented and it was difficult to secure clearly what was being voted upon).

Another resolution "that this meeting is in favor of a two school system in North Halton with the school in Milton remaining as it is" was not voted upon when no second could be secured.

After the meeting adjourned little groups discussed the problem which seems to become more and more confused and further from any agreement.
