Highway, east of Nelson This will necessitate the construction of an earthern dam of considerable proportions. This will form a catch basin which will cover several of the acres. Numerous springs arise below this area and it is the hope and opinion of the Halton Conser vation Committee, that a pond established above these springs on the escarpment will strnegthen and increase the flow of water. The Ontario Department of Agriculture is support to the experiment to the extent of furnishing financial aid to the amount of \$1.00 for each \$1.00 raised locally, to a maximum of \$1000 Halton County Council has adopted the principle of furnishing the \$1.00 for each \$1.00 supplied by the property owner.
