

content with their lot. It is easy to make a unique festive setting in your home these days with such variety of choice ir. wreaths, flowers, balls, bells, makes six servings. Santa Clauses, reindeer, sleighs, Christmas trees, church and snow scenes. It is wise to select one theme and one centre of attraction for a special decoration. 




