tect of te address delivered by Alex Jerior Muir of Woodstock at the recent Crop Convention in Toronto, Halton farmers who took the Bus Trip spensored by the Halton Crop Improvement Association last May, will recall the visit paid to the Mulr farm just west of Woodstock It occurs to us that the address in question contains a good deal of es it is worthy of consideration Here are some of the highlights from his address:
