**SPRING CARE OF LAWNS**

A little extra attention to the garden lawn in the early spring will often improve its appearance throughout the year. As soon as it is reasonably dry from winter snow, it should be well raked with a bamboo or flexible steel grass rake. A garden rake should be avoided as it is too drastic a treatment and tends to tear up the roots. Delay the raking if the ground is found to be so soft that footmarks are noticeable; high heels in particular will leave depressions which may remain all summer.

Rolling is not as essential as many people think, and is necessary only in those regions where heaving results from the action of frost. Although rolling is not usually harmful on light soils, it causes heavier soils to compact, a condition detrimental to the growth of grass. A more effective and desirable method of smoothing small depressions in the lawn is top-dressing.

Early spring is a good time to fertilize. The most common cause of poor lawns is low soil fertility. Since grass is constantly growing and producing new leaves, a suitable fertilizer is one high in nitrogen. It is important that the fertilizer be spread evenly. It is a good plan to divide it into equal parts and to spread each half uniformly over the entire lawn, in opposite directions. The lawn should be dry at the time of application and the fertilizer should be thoroughly watered in immediately after to avoid burning the foliage.

**Crossing Warning Signal Ordered For Mill Street**

Streplejacks gave a quotation on painting the water tank for \$275. The clerk was instructed to secure further information.

The following motion was passed: "Resolved that the Public Utilities Commission be authorized to have the water tank painted this spring and we strongly recommend that they have an inspector on the job to see that the work be carried on properly."

A letter from the county assessor urged Council that they send the assessor to a convention in Windsor. The letter was filed.

The clerk reported on the assessment on the Odds N' Ends Shop. He had investigated and was assured the business was still owned by Roe Ann Shops of Galt and therefore not liable for the transient traders' fee.

A letter from the Board of Transport Commission enclosed a copy of an official order to install a warning signal at the Mill Street crossing. The installation will include two flashing light signals and one bell. Cost was to be born by railway grade crossing fund, the railway and the municipality and installation made within ninety days from March 31st.

The Municipal Board gave notice that all holidays in the department were to be scheduled in August and pointed out matters to be before the Board should allow for this period.

A resolution was passed that lights be installed on Acton Boulevard from Queen Street north to Arthur Street, the committee to investigate so that the line could be continued when the street is completed.

The solicitor was instructed to investigate the matter of requiring that dogs be kept tied up at all times.

The Road Committee was to investigate the drainage on Queen Street and report back to Council on a solution of this problem. The Committee was also to investigate the roads to Wartime Housing.

The town foreman was to investigate a town roadway on Main St. opposite River Street and find out the street allowance.

The Solicitor read opinions of the Municipal World regarding the Hawkers and Pedlars regulations and the licensing of juke boxes.

The clerk was instructed to enforce collection of the rental for the booth in the park last season from E. W. Cole.

The clerk reported that he had an official offer for the purchase of 20 acres near the spring property of \$2000.

The Mayor, Reeve and Deputy Reeve were to interview Mr. John Sprawl regarding securing an additional supply of water.

Reeve Tyler reported on the purchase of land for a town dump and disposal plant and a roadway to the property from the third line.

Complaints regarding the collection of garbage were dealt with and Reeve Tyler, Deputy Reeve McLeod and Councillor Hotchen were appointed to prepare a by-law covering the collection of garbage.

Council agreed to supply Beardmore and Co. with filling material from their property on Queen St at 10¢ per yard.

Collection was to be made from the Hanna Construction Co. for fill supplied last year. The account had been rendered but had not been paid.

Council discussed with the resident engineer various matters regarding sewer construction, easement rights, etc. but left details to a meeting on Monday, April 24th.

In regard to appointment of an inspector of sewer construction, the following resolution was passed: The appointment of Mr. Cripps had been temporary as Mr. Vines had quit unexpectedly. "That we advertise for applications for the position of Town Inspector on the sewer installations, applications to be in by Monday, April 24th by 5 p.m."
