Oil vs. calcium chloride application on County roads was keenly debated by members of County Council at the regular meeting held at the County Buildings in Milton last Tuesday.

The discussion arose following the receiving of a petition signed by fifteen ratepayers situated on the half mile of road between flighway 7 and the village of Gien Williams. They asked Council to lay a hard top surface on the roadway, thus eliminating dust and other conditions on the road.

Headed by E. Fleck, a deputation presented their case to members. Mr. Plack informed Council the roadway is used day and night by trucks travelling to local stone quarries and gravel pits. He said that as many as 45 trucks were using this road daily. "This heavy traffic makes it hard to keep the road in repair and the constant traffic creates a dust nuisance, making many people stay in doors," he


