County Council Considers Problem of Dusty Roads

Oil vs. calcium chloride application on County roads was keenly debated by members of County Council at the regular meeting held at the County Buildings in Milton last Tuesday.

The discussion arose following the receiving of a petition signed by fifteen ratepayers situated on the half mile of road between Highway 7 and the village of Glen Williams.

Headed by E. Fleck, a deputation presented their case to members. Mr. Fleck informed Council the roadway is used day and night by trucks travelling to local stone quarries and gravel pits.

Another spokesman told Council he had to keep his storm windows on all summer to keep the dust from seeping into his home.

Mr. Smith County Engineer, informed members it would be impossible to construct a hard road at this time of year.

Council approved Warden Vanickie's suggestion that an inspection of County roads be made by the Road Committee next Monday.

Deputy Reeve H. Allen, Burlington, told of the successful application of oil on the streets of Burlington.

Progress is being made with plans for the construction of the new County Home for the Aged, reported Deputy Reeve Joe Wickson.

Council left a petition from the fact-finding committee for the village of Bronte in abeyance, which asked for the use of county road equipment to maintain streets.
