**New Bus Contracts Discussed By Board**

A four hour session of the North Halton District High School Board dealt with a wide variety of problems in connection with operating the three schools.

Reconsideration of bus contracts was requested by Mr. Poole who had had his minimum mileage reduced. Previous contracts since the inauguration had carried a minimum daily mileage. After thorough discussion Mr. Poole's contract was amended to take up to the minimum of 80 miles daily and Mr. Ingle's contract was amended to 88 miles daily.

Mr. Whitlock was granted permission to use the Milton School for classes in adult education one night per week for 12 weeks through the fall and winter. Carrying costs will be paid by the classes and use of the equipment is subject to approval of Mr. Marcellos principal.

Blue Cross proposals were referred to the principals after an explanation by Mr. Cameron.

Mr. Colling of the Nelson Burlington Board suggested a joint meeting of all boards with a view to having the north parts of Nelson and Trafalgar Townships put in the Milton School District. It was pointed out that such was the original plan and that the North Halton Board had always been willing to include these sections but correspondence and meetings had taken on the section from the Milton section.

Permission was granted Clifford Norrish of Nassagaweya to attend Guelph Collegiate.

Mileage allowance of 10¢ per mile was to be allowed Mr. Bradley, attendance officer, for trips outside of Milton in the rural district.

The Board approved of having Miss Dorothy Stone of Georgetown teach art in the Acton School.

Accounts were passed for payment.

Various requests of the principals of the schools were dealt with. An amount of \$120 was granted to pay transportation of players and pupils to the inter-school rugby games that are scheduled for this fall. This will require six trips by the Georgetown Transportation Co.

Prices on sites for the location of a central school were received and the secretary was instructed to write the Minister of Education requesting that he visit these sites and give guidance in the selection of the most suitable location. The building committee was urged to have this completed before the next regular meeting.

The Board was agreed to deed to the town of Georgetown 26 feet adjoining the High School for the purpose of opening a street. This would allow completion of arrangements for purchase of a site for a new public school there.
