Reconsideration of bus contracts was requested by Mr Poole who had had his minimum mileage reduced Previous contracts since the inauguration had carried a minimum daily mileage After thorough discussion Mr Poole's contract was amended to take up to the minimum of 80 miles daily and Mr Ingle's contract was amended to 88 miles daily
