A half-ton truck from Acton skidded on the wet road on Leitch's Hill, No. 24 highway, on Thanksgiving night and upset, lodging on its top in the ditch. The driver was not injured.
Leslie Woods, Belwood, driving a new car collided with the rear end of a cattle truck on North Main Street on Monday, October 23rd, when the brakes failed, doing considerable damage to the vehicle.
