Mrs. Sophia Patterson, Campbellville, the district's oldest resident, celebrated her 95th birthday on Tuesday, November 29th at her home in Campbellville. She has resided here for 80 years and has been a diligent worker and member in St. David's Presbyterian Church and is an honorary member of the W.M.S. Ladies Aid and Women's Institute Societies.

She has enjoyed good health until two months ago when she fell on her kitchen floor and fractured her hip. Dr. W. O. Warr is attending her. She is able to sit up in bed and feed herself each day. Her favorite pastimes are knitting, crocheting and quilt making. In recent years she is known to have turned out a tremendous amount of knitted goods for the Red Cross and other organizations. Mrs. Patterson is the only one of her family surviving and was predeceased by her husband several years ago. She has six children living: three boys and three girls.
