Vice-chairman R. Garbett presented a motion of the Board expressing appreciation of the work of Chairman G. A. Dills during the year and his conduct of meetings and board business. In replying Mr. Dills expressed appreciation of the fine co-operation that had been given by Board members and officials that had made his duties light and pleasant.

A financial statement was presented by the secretary treasurer which showed that the Board had kept within their budget during the year. Total estimated expenditures for the year were \$447,547.40 and total personnel grants were estimated at \$40,575.47. The tax levy for debentures and maintenance were estimated at \$37,113.46.
