### Water Bills Double To Pay Debentures

S. Esen told council that the lateral to the property on Mill St. now tenanted by Carroll's was not deep enough to drain the cellar floor and asked that it be corrected. Council pointed out that the lateral had been installed under the ownership of the former owner and apparently to his satisfaction. Mr. Esen said he had been told that the lateral would drain the cellar floor. Council felt Mr. Wolford former owner of the building was responsible to Mr. Esen not the council.

Town Foreman A. Kirkness reported that if the cold weather continued, ice would be ready in the arena for skating on the week end. Council discussed the organization of the arena for the current year. It was decided to advertise for an arena manager and a man to make ice. Until applications for these positions had been accepted, Ray Thompson, chairman of the building committee, was given power to hire temporary help to operate the arena during the Christmas season.

Members of the Planning Board, J. Creighton, T. Jones and C. Hansen met with council. The group decided to wait until the new year before forming their executive and committees since the mayor and a representative of the council will be a part of the Planning Board.

A complaint was received regarding the inadequacy of street lighting on Wallace St. The Street Committee was to investigate this complaint. Council also felt the lights had been going off too early in the morning.

A letter from the Canadian National Railways complimented the town on its publicity folder and promised distribution to England and other branches of its office.

Mayor Mason and Councillor Thompson were appointed as county representatives to accompany Public School trustees Watson and Jones in seeking approval for the erection of the new Public School. Solicitor Leatherland and Clerk McGeachie were to accompany the representatives.

A letter from the Department of Highways said there would be "no question of sanding" the main streets through town and that as long as the streets were kept in a fairly smooth condition they would snow plow them. The department pointed out that they would not keep a plow on rough streets.

A resolution was passed authorizing payment for the telephone in Corp. Mason's home as it was listed under Provincial Police.

The outline for a plan of organization regarding Civil Defense was received. This material was filed for the consideration of the 1951 council.

Mayor Mason signed a borrowing note of \$4000 for payments on water main extensions until the debentures are sold.


