Both before and after the Midget game, the Georgetown Girls' Pipe Band entertained with music.

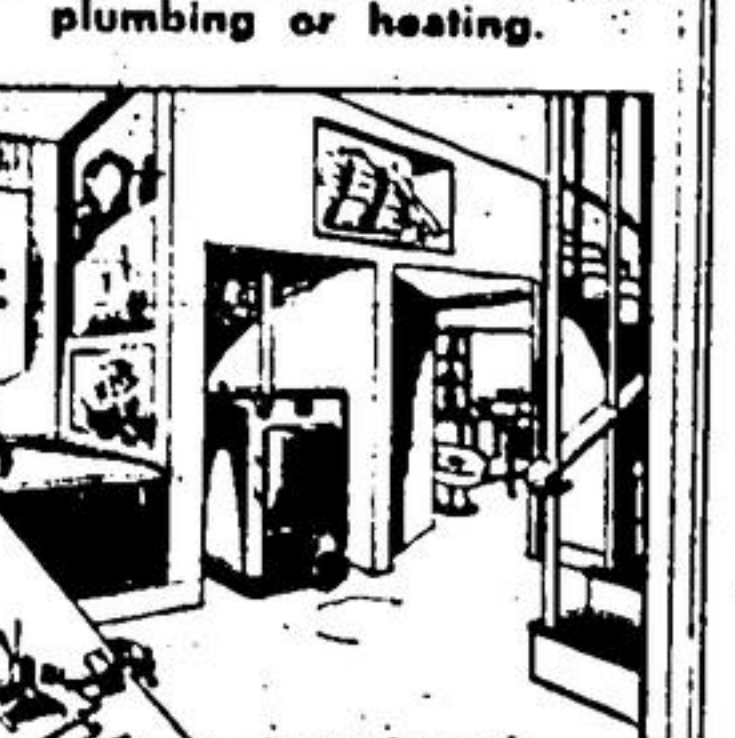

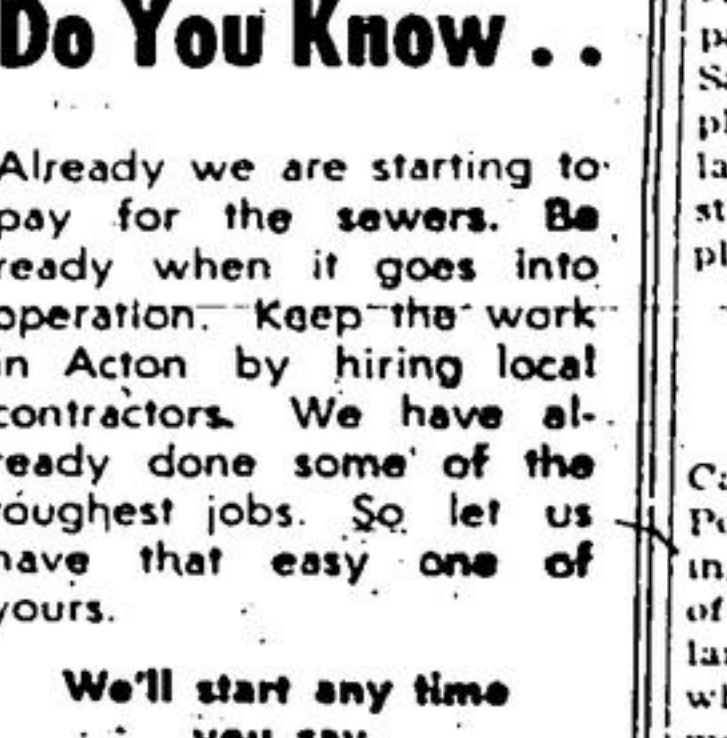

Despite the fact that medical science has proven that unpasteurized milk is an excellent culture medium and can carry germs which can cause disease, it is reported by the Health League of Canada that many thousands of Canadians are taking a chance—yes, taking a chance by drinking unpasteurized milk.

Ontario and Saskatchewan, among the provinces, and hundreds of municipalities have compulsory pasteurization legislation, but there remains the problem of many farm families—even in Ontario and Saskatchewan—who drink the raw milk produced by their own cows.

The fact that many farm families are beginning to realize that raw milk from their own cows can be impure is reflected in the number of applications from the Health League.

The Health League points out that these people can become infected just as easily as other consumers of raw milk.

Simple Words Have Real Proven Value

We have often given similar advice. The reference to the uneducated is not quite fair. Any newspaper man could tell you that the worst sinners are likely to be the men with specialized college degrees.

Here is what we mean—and the examples are our own. We did not borrow them from "Plain Words" or any other volume.

Deer in agricultural areas are a problem as the deer are the cause of a large number of accidents on roads, causing damage to cars. It has been very fortunate that most of the accidents have only involved damage to cars rather than injuries to the occupants.

The deer are protected by law and have increased to quite large numbers in some areas. In order to reduce the numbers of deer legally, the Department of Lands and Forests has had open seasons in Townships. Sixteen Townships had an open season in the Huron District in the fall of 1950.

It has been demonstrated that a three day open season will not clean out all the deer in an area, so that people who love to see wildlife will still see deer in the woodlots and the open fields.

The Department does not assume any liability for damage done by wildlife. If wildlife such as deer is doing damage, they will give a permit to shoot the deer but the meat has to be turned over to a charitable institution.

An open season throughout all of Southern Ontario has been advocated and it seems as if it might be the logical answer to the problem.
