the Greatest Sin, 12: 28-31. Jesus had silenced both the Pharisees and Sadducees who had sought to entrop Him and confuse Him. A scribe who had listened was deeply impressed by the reasoning of Jesus. Then he asked a question. Matthew tells us that he dld it to tempt, or test Him (Matt. 22:35).
