Golden Text-Not what I will but what thou wilt. Mk. 14: 36. Lesson Text-Mk. 14: 22-26, 32

Exposition .- I. The Lord's Supper Established, 22-26.

Do the words, "This is my body" bread, it became the actual physical Body of Christ, or do they mean this bread represents my body, and just as you eat this bread and it becomes a part of you, so you are to est Me, and I will become a part of you? One can find the answer to this question by noting the force "is" in Ezek. 5: 4, 5; 1 Cor. 10: 4, 16; 11: 25; Ezek. 37: 11; Matt. 13: Luke. 12: 1; Jno. 10: 7; Rev. 1: 20; Gal. 4: 25. But after all has been said, there is doubtless a real presence of Christ in the elements, and when we do partake of them "discerning the Lord's Body" there is a real feeding upon Christ so that just as the bread we eat becomes a part of us, so He Himself becomes part of us (Jno. 6: 50, 51, 53-55) It is by faith that we feed upor Him (Jno. 6: 54, 57), but that faith alone is true faith that actually feeds upon Christ and appropriates to itself the life and strength that there is in Him. There can be no covenant between a Holy God and a sinful man except on the ground of shed blood (v. 24; cf. Heb. 9: 18-23). The blood is the life and the ife must be poured out whereve there is sin if there is to be forgivesins" (Matt. 26: 28).

"II: Jesus Sorrowing-Even Unto Death, 32-34.

Jesus took all the disciples excepting Judas with Him to Gethsemano, but He left eight on the edge of the Garden and went into the deeper depths with only three. The three whom Jesus took with Him now were the same who went with Him to the Mount of Transfiguration. If He takes us to the Mount of Transfiguration, we may expect Him to take us also to the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus, as He came close-to the agony of the cross and of all involved in the
