Ont. Employment At All-time High

Employment in Ontario in December was riding at an all-time high, a reflection of the generally buoyant economic situation, the Bureau of Statistics and Research reports. The volume of business transactions, as recorded in th value of cheques cashed, is 19 per cent, above last year, representing a total of \$34.5 billion. The consumption of electrical power in the Province is over 8 per cent above last year's level.

R.O.P. Bred Chicks

The introduction of artificial methods of incubation is considered by officials to be one of the important steps in the forward march of the poultry industry in Canada. Annual chick production over the past few years has varied from 80 to po million chicks, with about 80 per cent of these being from approved hatcheries that operate under the National Poultry, Breeding Program; the estimated value of chicks and poults has ranged from \$16 million to \$24 mil-

Unlike some other types of farm products, hicks are not sold on the basis of eye appeal. It is the breeding behind them that counts, claim the experts, and most poultrymer will continue to purchase chicks from a broven source when they can do so. Progressive poultry producers soon discovered that cerinin poultry breeders' chicks are money makers because they have years of selection behind them for production, egg weight growth, ment production, livability, freedom from disease and other desirable qualities.
