THE MIXING BOWL

Hello Homemakers! The accepted and long established method of making cakes is undergoing great changes. Many packaged mixes are being bought, and no wonder, since the results are excellent.

- 1. Uneven hump service—too much flour or over-mixing. 2. Coarse texture—too much baking powder or wrong type of flour. 3. Dry or tough cake—too much flour or not enough sugar, shortening or liquid.

- 4. Grease cake—too much shortening or liquid or not enough sugar. 5. Streaks in cake—too much liquid in cake batter. 6. Falling of cake—too much leavening (soda or baking powder).

TAKE A TIP 1. Preheat oven to the correct temperature. Make sure top heat has been off for ten minutes before cake batter is put in the oven.
