A By-law to amend By-law No. 7, 1949, for the purpose of licensing Dogs under the Dog-tax and Live Stock Protection Act, R.S.O. Chapter 335, 1937, and the Dog-tax and Live Stock Protection Amendment Act of 1947.

A By-law for the purpose of Licensing all dogs owned, har bored or possessed by the assessed owner, or owners, tenant or tenants, and including any party and all parties residing in the as sessed household of any premises within the Municipality of the Township of Erin in accordance with the above paragraph.

Be it therefore and is hereby enacted that all dogs enumerated on any one premises cother than they that possess a Kennel License) shall be beensed as per the following schedule namely:
