## Canada's Window Visible Tomorrow

Canada's Show Window received its final polishing this week before the turnstiles begin clicking through millions of visitors to the world's largest annual exposition. From the time General George C. Marshall, United States Secretary of Defence, opens the Canadian National Exhibition tomorrow, until the last fireworks on September 8, almost 3,000,000 persons are expected to enter the huge Exhibition Park spread along Toronto's lakeshore. And this district will doubtless be well represented.

Last year the Exhibition played host to 2,723,000 visitors, an all-time record. This year, the 72nd in the C.N.E.'s history, a new attendance record is expected. Attractions, to suit every taste have been scheduled. To some, the big event will be Jimmy Durante and the grandstand spectacle. Others will be attracted to the great United States Air Force Band which is back this year by popular request.

The 350 acres of Exhibition Park are dedicated to the encouragement of agriculture, industry and the arts. Stretching along one-and-one-half miles of Toronto shoreline, more than \$45,000,000 of buildings have been erected to house the "Show Window of the Nation."

On the largest stage of its kind in the world, the owner of the largest nose in show business will entertain audiences of 26,000 every night.
