



Record Dairy Cattle Show at Milton

In recent years the dairy cattle show at the Milton Fair has always been an outstanding feature. This year, however, saw all previous records broken, with a total of 340 head and 412 entries parading in the Holstein, Jersey, and Guernsey rings.

The Senior and Grand Championship for males went to R. C. Alexander's Salax Prince, which later went on to the Grand Championship. The Reserve Senior Championship male was A. B. C. Midlight Joe, for J. F. Trimble, while the Reserve Grand Championship for males went to A. M. Brain and Sons' Junior champion.

In the Junior Championship for females, R. C. Alexander had both the Junior Champion and the Reserve Junior Champion, on Cora Salax and Lady Salax respectively. For the Senior and Grand Championship female, A. G. Hunter's Rambleside Maxine Wayne took the award with the Reserve Senior and Reserve Grand Championship going to F. O. Hunter's Golden Hill Mercena Souvenir.

In the open get-of-sire class, J. F. Trimble had the winner on his get of Glenview Jemima Ace, and thereby won the Bank of Nova Scotia special. The same exhibitor won the Bank of Commerce Special with his progeny of Pontiac Segis Helena. Mr. Trimble also won the T. Eaton Co. special with his Senior Herd, and also the Premier Exhibitor award of the E. J. Mengher Memorial Trophy.

Halton Jersey Breeders Win County Herd Honors in Championship Show

The Western Ontario Championship show sponsored by the Ontario Jersey Club was held at Simcoe, on Wednesday of last week. Notwithstanding the fact that Halton breeders did not send down their usual number of entries, they nevertheless were prominent and in the County Herd class took the top award.

In addition, Gerald R. Graham won the Reserve Senior and Reserve Grand Championships for males on his three year old herd sire Golden Meadow Butterfly. The same exhibitor also had the winning two year old heifer dry, in Bonde's Tiny Basil Lass. Mr. Graham also had the 7th prize Senior Bull Calf; the 8th and 13th prizes in the Junior Heifer calves; 4th and 8th in the Senior Heifer calves; and 7th prize Junior Yearling.

M. C. Beaty who normally takes down a full string, had not intended to exhibit but in order to make up the required number for the County Herd, sent down one unit, which placed 3rd in a strong class of Junior Yearlings. Featherstone Bros. constituted the only other Halton exhibitor, and they had the 4th prize Junior Bull calf; 5th and 6th prize Senior Yearlings; 2nd and 5th prize two year old heifers in milk; in addition to some other awards.

This does not by any means constitute a full report of the winnings by the three Halton exhibitors, but nevertheless is an indication that they can hold their own in any company, and the winning of the Inter-County Herd class was a real honor to bring back to the County of Halton.

Junior Farmer Section at Milton Highly Commended A new feature at the Milton Fair as a result of its Class "B" rating was the Junior Farmer Section. This included separate classes in inter-club displays for Junior Farmers; Junior Institutes; Junior Homemakers and Girls' Garden Clubs.
