SHOW GROWTH OF MANY ONTARIO COMMUNITIES

A further list of census figures for various towns and villages has been released by the Dominion Department of Statistics. Growth is shown in nearly every instance over the 1941 figures, in some cases quite a substantial amount.

Brampton now has a population of 8.337 against a 1941 population of 6,020; Barrie has grown from 9.725 to 12,434 in the ten years; Bracebridge now has 2,636 against 2.341 ten years ago; Fergus has 3.377 as against 2,832 in 1951; Alliston shows 1,968 and in 1941 had 1.733; Waterloo 11.979 as compared with 9,025.


