Mrs. Jones was spending a day in bed with a severe cough, and her husband was working in the backyard and hammering nails into some boards.

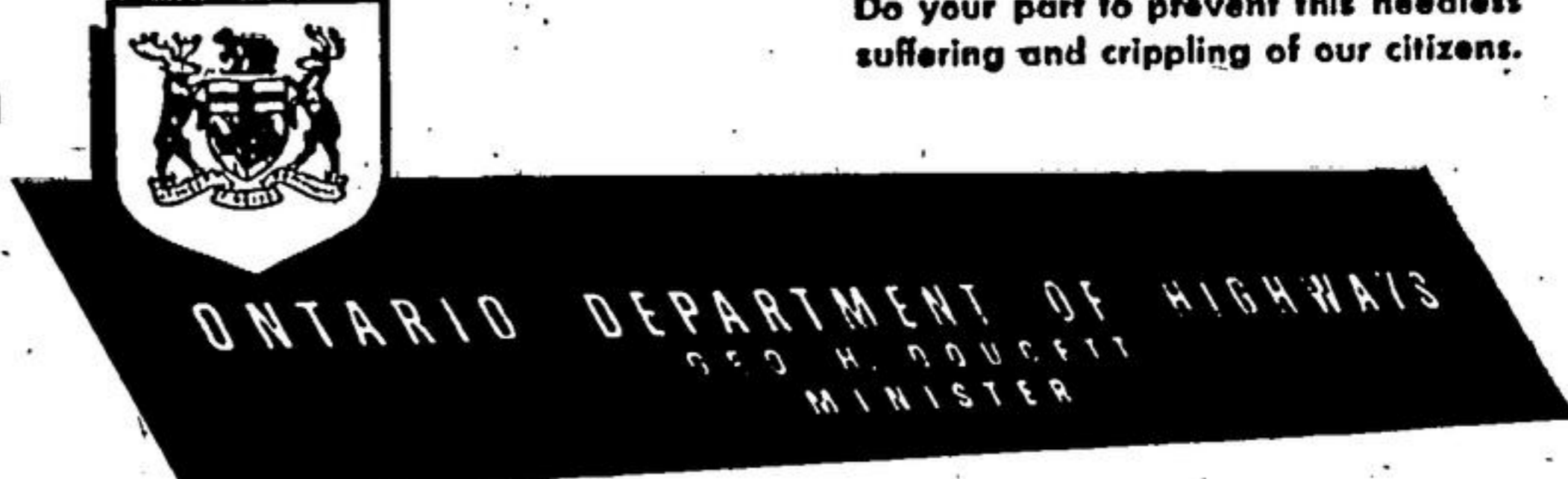
Presently his neighbour came over. "How's the wife?" he asked. "Not very well," replied Jones.



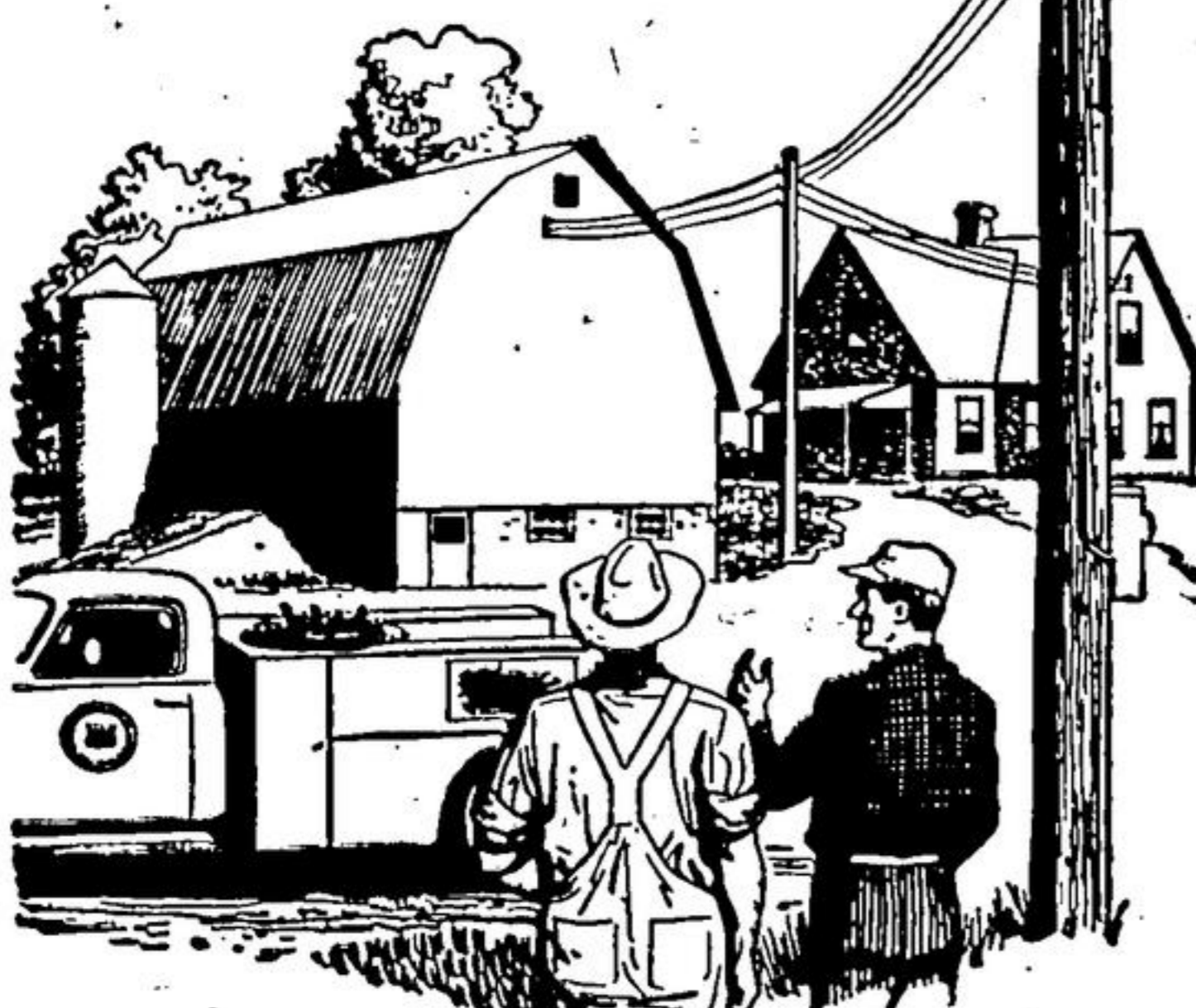
STAY OUT OF HOSPITAL

HYDRO RURAL FAMILY MORE THAN DOUBLED SINCE THE WAR

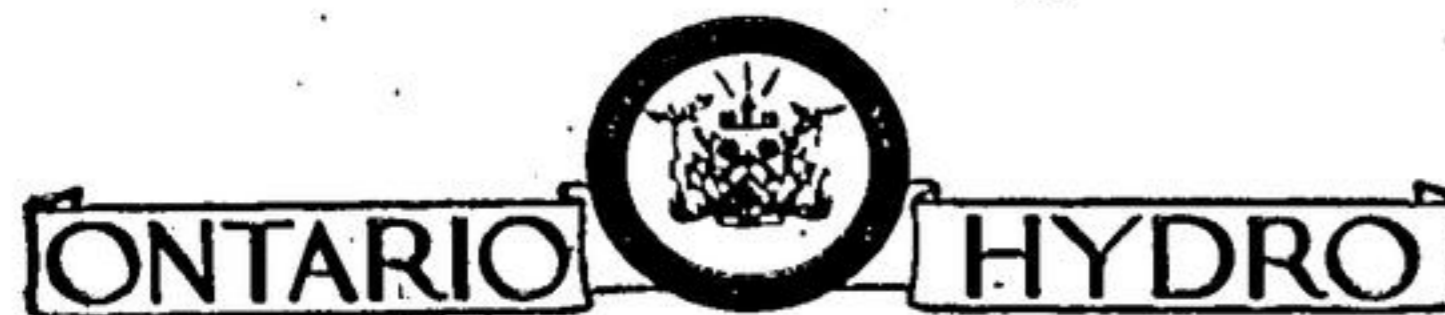
