**Dividend Passed By Wool-Combing**

Wool Combing Corp. of Canada will not pay the quarterly dividend which normally would be payable January 10, 1952.

Due to unsatisfactory conditions in the textile field, demand for the company's services in the wool combing industry has seriously declined. Vice-president K. L. Markon says until a satisfactory volume of business and earnings have again been attained, it is thought wise to conserve the company's resources.

The unsatisfactory condition of the business is in no way due to recent fluctuations in the price of wool, as the company does not carry any inventories of wool or wool products and operates entirely on a commission basis, combing for others. The wool combing industry in Canada has no tariff protection whatsoever, Mr. Markon points out.
