

Statistics Bureau Seek Co-operation

Each December, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, in co-operation with the Ontario Department of Agriculture, conducts a survey of the number of live stock on farms and cost of hired labor. Forms for this survey have been mailed out and are now in the hands of farmers.

The success of this survey depends on the co-operation of farmers in filling in and returning the questionnaires. A widespread response from all types of farmers throughout the province is needed in order that the statistics can be based on a sufficiently large number of reports from a representative sample of farms throughout Ontario.

The statistics obtained from the

survey are used extensively throughout the year by government farm organizations and farm co-operatives, banks, industry, various farm commodity marketing boards and by farmers themselves to obtain basic information and facts in order to more effectively plan future operations. International organizations, such as the World Food and Agriculture Organization, depend on the government to supply up-to-date figures on Ontario's agricultural industry.

The survey has absolutely no connection with taxation. The farmer's individual form is seen only by workers in the Dominion and Provincial agricultural statistical offices and the farmer is protected by law against the wrong use of his return. All individual forms are kept strictly confidential and are used only for the preparation of county and provincial totals.

BY-LAW No. 932

A By-law to authorize the imposition upon Owners or occupants of land who derive or will or may derive a benefit from the construction of the Sewage Disposal System, as authorized by By-law No. 892, a sewer rate sufficient to pay one half the cost of the work.

WHEREAS a sewage disposal system, including a disposal plant, has been constructed under the authority of By-law No. 892, and WHEREAS the said By-law provides that one-half of the cost thereof shall be collected by a sewer rate, and WHEREAS Sec. 389 subsections 2, 5 and 6 of the Municipal Act, 1950, R.S.O. Chapter 243 authorizes the passing of this By-law with the approval of the Municipal Board to establish a sewer rate structure upon which sewer rates shall be based and calculated, and WHEREAS it is necessary to collect in each of the years 1951 to 1970 inclusive by way of sewer rental the sum of \$12,000.00, and WHEREAS this Council deem it advisable to differentiate between the several classes of works, the kinds of benefits accruing, and all other relevant matters to ensure that such sewer rates are imposed upon a basis that is equitable and just, and WHEREAS the Ontario Municipal Board did by Order dated the ninth day of January 1951 approve the passing of this By-law,

Be it therefore enacted by the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Acton as follows:

1. A total amount of \$12,000.00 shall be collected in each of the years 1951 to 1970 inclusive from all owners and/or occupants of land who use water and/or sewers in the Town of Acton, because they derive or will or may derive a benefit from the sewage disposal system, with the exception as set out in paragraph 3 hereof. The said sum of \$12,000.00 is the estimated one-half annual capital cost of the said work.

2. The said sum shall be levied and collected as follows:

(a) A service charge on all water supplied:

(i) 1/2 inch pipe line to consumer—\$1.34 per two months.

(ii) 3/4 inch pipe line to consumer—\$2.00 per two months.

(iii) 1 inch pipe line to consumer—\$3.00 per two months.

(iv) 1 1/2 inch pipe line to consumer—\$3.50 per two months.

(v) 2 inch pipe line to consumer—\$5.36 per two months.

(f) 2 inch pipe line to consumer—\$0.33 per two months.

(g) 3 inch pipe line to consumer—\$16.00 per two months.

(h) 4 inch pipe line to consumer—\$26.00 per two months.

For each family there shall be paid the following services charges:

Supplied through 1/2 inch pipe line, \$1.34 for every two months.

(i) A consumption charge on all water supplied of .35c per thousand gallons for the first two months, with the exceptions hereinafter stated.

(j) A consumption charge on all water supplied of .20c per thousand gallons for the each additional one thousand gallons supplied every two months, with the exceptions hereinafter stated.

(k) A consumption charge on all water supplied to industries using less than 200,000 gallons per two months of .20c per thousand gallons.

(l) A consumption charge on all water supplied to industries using 200,000 gallons or more per two months of .15c per thousand gallons.

(m) There shall be a minimum charge of \$1.58 bi-monthly.

3. The said sewer rental shall be collected by the Acton Public Utilities Commission which shall be the agent of the Corporation for such purpose.

4. Accounts shall be rendered inclusive with or without at the same time as the water rates.

5. A discount of ten per cent. shall be given for payment on or before the twentieth of the month in which the account is rendered.

6. All accounts shall be rendered, if possible, on or before the tenth day of the month, the owner or occupant shall receive a discount of ten per cent. if the account is paid within ten days of the date of mailing.

7. In the event that the account is not rendered, on or before the tenth day of the month, the owner or occupant shall receive a discount of ten per cent. if the account is paid within ten days of the date of mailing.

8. Revenue derived in any year from the sewer rate hereby imposed shall be applied and used towards payment of principal and interest due in that year upon debentures issued for the work for the capital cost of which the sewer rate is imposed and shall be transferred by the Acton Public Utilities Commission to a special trust for that purpose.

9. The sewer rate imposed hereby upon any owner or occupant of land shall be a lien and charge upon the land, and if the same or any part thereof remains unpaid after due date, the amount unpaid may be collected by distress upon the goods and chattels of such owner or occupant; or the clerk of the municipality, upon notice to him of the amount due, the person by whom it is due and the land upon which a lien is claimed, shall enter the same upon the collector's roll and the collector shall proceed to collect the same in the same way, as nearly as may be, as municipal taxes are collectable.

10. Every person who uses the sewer for disposal purposes of fluid which is not being metered into the premises shall pay at the option of the Corporation:

(a) a flat rate of \$4.90 bi-monthly, or

(b) a sewer meter rental based on the rates provided in section 2 hereof. The sewer meter shall be provided by the Town and shall remain the property of the Town on the same terms and conditions as water meters.

11. No moneys shall be deducted from the aforesaid sums so collected as a sewer rental for collection charges, overhead or otherwise, and the full amount collected shall be applied on the debentures.

12. No roof water or outside drain water shall be admitted into the sewer, or be discharged into the sewer, and no water containing in excess of 275 BOD shall be admitted into the sewer or be discharged into the sewer.

13. All of Registered Plan 275 in the Town of Acton and that parcel or tract of land and premises situated, being and being formerly in the Township of Easthope, in the County of Huron and Province of Ontario, being comprised of all that part of the East 1/2 of Lot 20, Township 29 North, Range 10 East, Third Concession and also a portion of the said Township, which is not shown on Registered Plan 275 is exempt from this By-law until such time as sewers are constructed in this area.

READ a First and Second time this 2nd day of January, 1951.

READ a Third time and passed this thirteenth day of January, 1951.
