Hello Homemakers! for Easter dinner was as much a part of this feative occasion as hot cross buns and candled eggs. Gone are the days when the ment had to be brined and pickled since the cured hams have a deliciously sweet, spicey flavor.

When you buy smoked ham with bone-in, you have a choice of two types; cooked ready-to-eat or regular uncooked. Both are similar in appearance and are sure to be tender. Neither requires soaking or boiling but the cooked-ham-requires heating for 15 mintes at 325 degrees to be at its best while 2 or 3 times. the regular ham requires 12 to 15 minutes per pound.

kitchen you may order a canned dripping and kept in refrigerator. ham which will cost about the same as the cooked sliced ham, However, it was with considerable pride that we baked and decorated a large ham for Easter. Cured ment keeps longer than fresh meat so the leftovers need not be served for consecutive meals and it gives you good emergency food for refrigerator raids or funch box anndwiches.



3. You can cook the bone to flavor either pea or bean soup.

Since dates and raisins are quite inexpensive items these days decorate the baked ham with either of them; toward the end of baking time, remove the ham from the oven, take off the skin, score the fat and stud it with whole cloves. Arrange sliced dates or plumped raisins in scored slits of fat. Combine 4 cup sugar, 4 cup vinegar and I teaspoon dry mustard. Use half the sauce to spoon over the top of ham then return to the oven at a temperature of 350. Ten minutes before the end of the baking period add the remaining
