ASSESSMENT AND MUNICIPAL TAXATION IN ONTARIO

The Last of the Series BY GEORGE W. JAMES

Great strides in proper assessment methods have been made in the last ten to afteen years Prior to that time most assessment valuations were made on the "guess" method. Only a small percentage of our municipalities had proper records of property and included in the number which did not, were some of the larger municipalities. However, with the advent of

the county assessment system. the formation of the Association of Assessing Officers of Ontario, and the assistance given to municipalities by the Assessment Branch of the Department of Municipal Affairs since the present Minister inaugurated the Branch in 1947, the aituation has materially improved.

It is hard to conceive that some municipalities are still reluctant to install a modern and scientific system of appraisals in view of the fact that a proper assessment system is the whole keystone of municipal government. The cost s small and the benefits great.

The preliminary task is to measure the exterior of all buildings. The square foot area or the cubic foot capacity of the buildings are then calculated. It is suggested that the more equitable and easier method is to value residential, farm heating, plumbing, wiring, etc.


