ACTON PEOPLE AND ACTON PLACES THROUGH MANY YEARS

This is a cutting from the stump of the Big Willow Tree panted by the late William Steel, on his property, corner Mill and Willow Streets, Acton, in the spring of 1853. It gave the street its name. The tree was quate solid, measufing 16 feet, 9 inches in circumference on the stump, and was cut down to make room for the new Merchants Bank Building, now in the course of erection as part of the Warren Block."
