



## **AUTO** - biographies

ACTON PEOPLE AND ACTON PLACES THROUGH MANY YEARS

The building now occupied by B. D. Rachlin was erected by the late W. H. Storey, Acton's first reeve, and the founder of the Canada Glove Works. He came to Acton about 1866 and opened

a saddlery and harness business here. By hard work and the manufacture of first class goods he soon built up a large trade. In 1868 he made sheepskin harvest mitts as an adjunct to his business. He made a specialty of buckskin gloves and his staff grew. It was about this time that

the glove shop was popularly called "The Buckskin Academy." After a few years Mr. Storey took a partner, the late James Moore, and the firm became W. H. Storey and Co. The Storey residence in the next block was built mow the Victor B. Rumley Funeral Home).

Well over 50 years ago the present building was built and is now one of Acton's major industries. (To be Continued)
