Another novel about the South a little over a century ago—the deep south, with graciousness, lavishness, beauty, lushness—all inevitable—forming the typical plantation setting for—what else?—romance.

Jeffrey Hayven was the master of Demaret, a cotton plantation on the Mississippi, naturally. And romantic Demaret had a new mistress, Laura. Among her admirers are lovely, wilful and temperamental.

Jeffrey's twin brother Noel is the third point of the eternal triangle. The author's own childhood was spent on a plantation like Demaret. Increased Hog Marketings for Fall Hogs

A release, was recently received from Elgin Senn, Live Stock Marketing Service of the Dominion Department of Agriculture. The estimate covers hog marketings at Yards and Plants for the period October to December inclusive. It would suggest that the increase first manifest a year or more ago, has been continued but with diminishing vigor. Prospects point to an increase of 0.9% over the same period a year ago. The Western Provinces have not reached anywhere near their recovery possibilities and consequently they may better the estimate of 14.9% increase. In Eastern Canada where production is always more stabilized, prospects point to an increase of 0.6%. Estimates made by other sources range all the way from 10% less in Ontario, to 20% more. Our livestock officials of the Dominion Department, however, are of the opinion that Ontario marketings for the last three months of 1952 are likely to equal those of the same period of 1951 and perhaps 10% more.

Beef Cattle Prices Continue Strong

Active trading supported by a good demand has resulted in higher prices for beef cattle on Canadian markets. During the past two weeks choice steers have brought as high as \$29.00 per cwt. This price when the exchange value of the Canadian dollar, etc., is taken into consideration means that our Canadian cattle are bringing very close to prices across the U.S. border. It makes one wonder if some of our feeders are wise in holding cattle which are already finished. In other words are cattle prices likely to strengthen much about present prices, if and when the embargo is removed? If our livestock officials are correct there are a lot of cattle which will have to be marketed between now and the end of the year. If the present embargo remains against Canadian cattle, it would seem logical to us to anticipate lower rather than higher prices between now and 1953.

Interest Keen in Farm Ponds

Since the Farm Pond Policy was approved by the Halton County Council on March 11th last, some 43 Halton landowners have submitted applications to J. E. Whitelock, secretary of the Halton Conservation Committee. The proposed sites have all been surveyed or inspected by a representative of the Department of Agricultural Engineering at the Ontario Agricultural College. Due to soil conditions which make water holding ability of the proposed ponds rather problematical, thirteen of the proposed sites were not approved.

In other words thirty sites have been approved, but it would not appear that more than twenty of these will be subsidized under the Halton policy in 1952. It will be recalled that under the policy suggested by the Halton Conservation Committee and approved by the Halton County Council \$2,000 is available for ponds constructed in the period March 11, 1952 to Dec. 31st, 1952. Fifty per cent. of this amount is provided by the Halton County Council, and an equal amount by the Ontario Department of Agriculture. The policy in question provides a subsidy of fifty per cent. of the cost up to a maximum of \$100 on any approved pond. If the first twenty applicants construct approved ponds each costing \$200, or more to construct, that will take the entire \$2,000 available under the policy. At a recent meeting of the Halton Conservation Committee it was agreed however, that in the event the policy is continued in 1953, then those who do not qualify in the first twenty, will automatically go on the priority list for 1953. While Halton is the only county in the province to adopt a farm pond policy, several river valley authorities have launched similar subsidized projects.

In the last year 16,000 workers in Canada's textile industries have been discharged and most of the remaining 90,000 are on short time. This unemployment has not resulted from a decrease in textile purchases but from increased imports of cheap goods.
