OBITUARY

William H. Hortop Dies On Monday

William Henry Hortop of Everton, who is well-known throughout this district, died after a brief illness at the Guelph General Hospital Monday. Mr. Hortop, who was in his 78th year, was admitted to the hospital on Friday.

For many years he had been active in the flour milling business at Everton. In later years, he has been assisted by his sons in the business.

He was a member of Walker Lodge, Acton, of which he was a Past Master and for many years was a trustee of S. S. No. 7, Eramosa township. He was also secretary of the Everton Cemetery board for a number of years.

One of his chief interests, however, was the annual Erin Fall Fair, at which he officiated as a judge for 50 years. He also judged roots and crops at Fergus, Arthur, Acton and Georgetown fairs. In addition, the late Mr. Hortop was a keen fancier of harness horses.

He was a member of the Disciple Church in Everton. He was born in the house where he lived throughout his life and was the son of the late James and Mrs. Hortop. His father was for a time registrar of Crown deeds in Guelph but later started the milling business which has been carried on by the family ever since.

In 1890, in December, the late Mr. Hortop was married to Emma Benham of Eramosa, who survives him. Mrs. Hortop was the daughter of the late James and Mrs. Benham of that district. The wedding took place in Eramosa.

Surviving in addition to his widow are two sons, Clarence of Rockwood, Harry of Everton, and a daughter, Muriel (Mrs. Burt Palframan), R. R. 1, Guelph. Also surviving are a brother James of Blair, Ont., and two grandchildren. The funeral was held yesterday afternoon with service at the Victor B. Rumley Funeral Home, Acton. It was under Masonic auspices and interment took place in Everton Cemetery.
