Dr. Reiman spoke on Spain-land of extremes and drew his observations on Canada from the impression created in his mind following visit of European countries.

"Germany, Holland and other European countries are working. You can't defeat people like those in the British Isles. We're producing but it could be our undoing because people in these other countries can't buy it. Business can produce 40 per cent, cheaper in Germany than in America," the speaker concluded. *

Dr. Reiman presented a very real and interesting picture of the country of Spain, only recenty removed from behind the Iron Curtain. "In Spain you get antiquity, and modernity; wealth and poverty; beauty and squallor; heat and cold; compassion and cruelty," the speaker summarized.

"The greatest pleasures are social. From one o'clock to four everything is quiet-that is siesta time.
