'SPAIN--LAND OF EXTREMES' SUBJECT OF Y'S MEN'S CLUB SPEAKER AT MEET

"Canada is in a precarious position because of her success," Dr. G. E. Reiman, head of the English department at the Ontario Agricultural College declared when he addressed the Acton Y's Men's Club on Thursday last week.

Dr. Reiman spoke on Spain—land of extremes and drew his observations on Canada from the impression created in his mind following a visit of European countries.

"Germany, Holland and other European countries are working. You can't defeat people like those in the British Isles. We're producing but it could be our undoing because people in these other countries can't buy it. Business can produce 40 per cent. cheaper in Germany than in America," the speaker concluded.

Dr. Reiman presented a very real and interesting picture of the country of Spain, only recently removed from behind the Iron Curtain. "In Spain you get antiquity and modernity; wealth and poverty; beauty and squalor; heat and cold; compassion and cruelty," the speaker summarized.

"The greatest pleasures are social. From one o'clock to four everything is quiet—that is siesta time. At two the natives eat and the shops open from four to seven, and the people are on the street until 10. They start to eat at 9, theatres open at 10 and run until about 2:30 with dances going to about 4 a.m."

Bull fights on Sundays and holidays were vividly explained by the speaker as an example of Spain's cruelty in comparison with our standards.

"It's a fight between a bull and six men. The specially bred bulls are played by the gaily dressed matadors and picadors, mounted on horseback and carrying spike poles. They engage the bull, goading it, and cut its neck muscles. The matador takes two darts and in bal-
