At the Liberal Convention in Milton town hall on Saturday of last week a motion was also unanimously endorsed that "in recognition of the long and outstanding service in the government, Hughes S. Cleaver, Burlington, the present member for Halton, be appointed to the Senate."

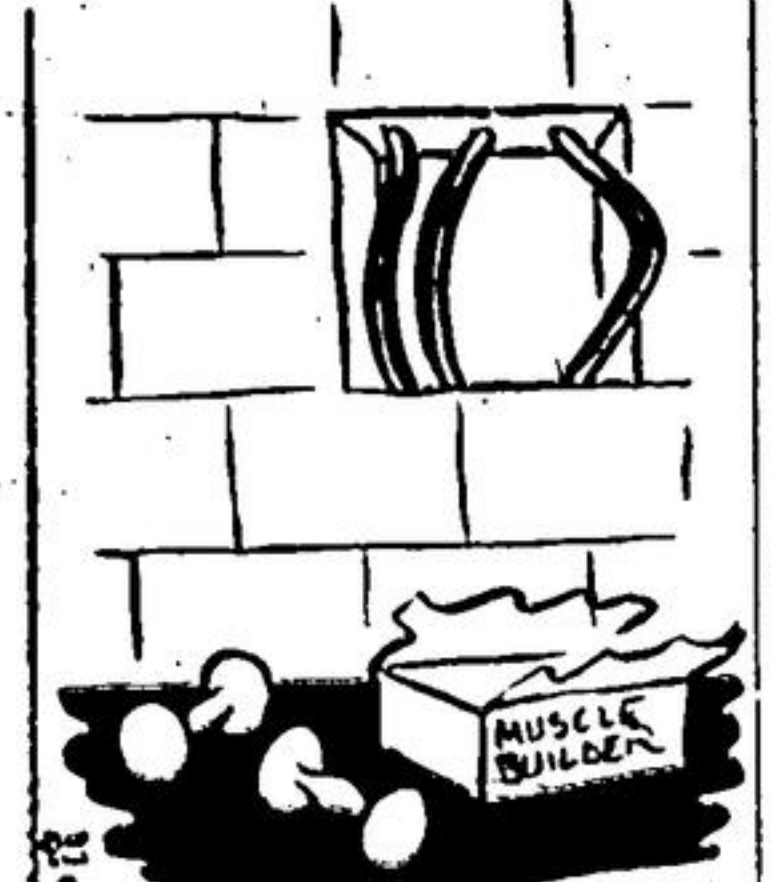
### Rev. R. Pickersgill Dies Suddenly

### At the Churches

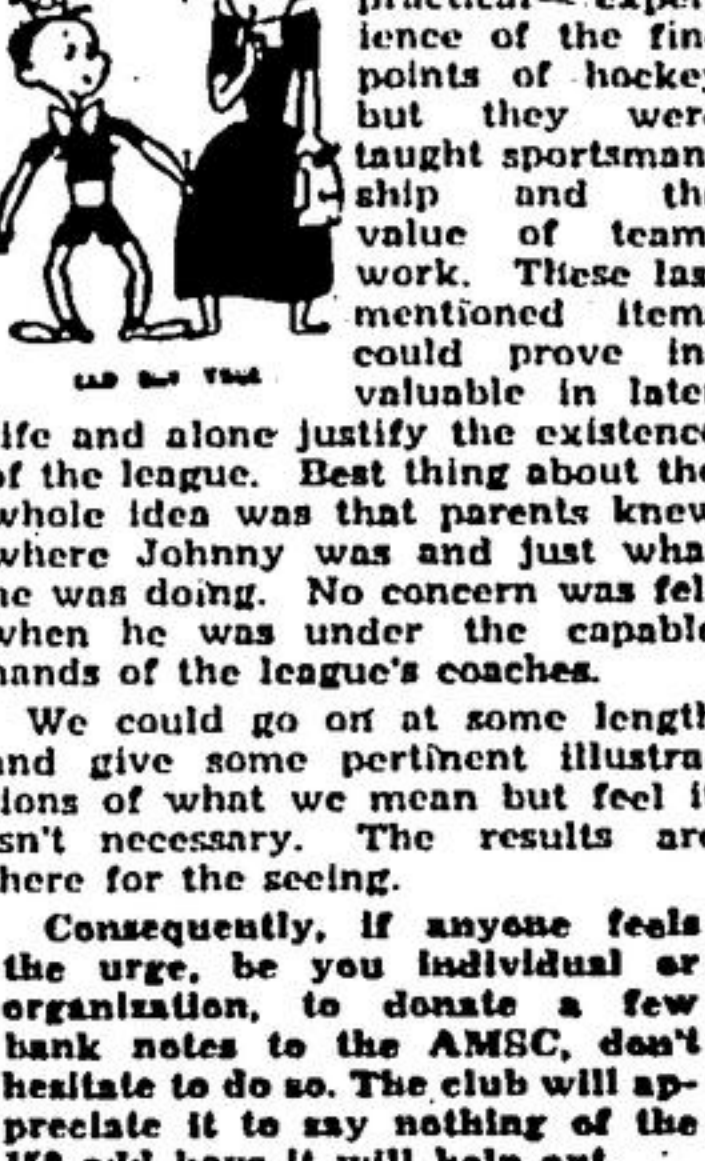
