### Andy Wilson Dies Following Illness

Following an illness of the past two months, Andrew Wilson passed away at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Toronto, on Wednesday, November 11th. He was born in Scotland, a son of the late Alexander Wilson and Rose Moore Wilson and was 40 years old. He came to Canada in 1927 and has resided in Acton for all that time except a few years spent in Detroit, Michigan, during the second World War and a member of Acton Branch of the Canadian Legion. He was a popular young man in the community and interested in minor sports activities. Mr. Wilson was an employee of the Storey Glove Co. and had also worked for Beardmore and Co.

Surviving are his wife, the former Winnifred Snyder, and a daughter, Margaret Rose. Two brothers, John of Acton, and Samuel of Detroit, and a sister, Mrs. Joseph Lavale, of Ottawa, also remain to mourn his passing.

The funeral was held on Friday with service at the Victor B. Rumley Funeral Home, conducted by Rev. R. H. Armstrong of Knox Presbyterian Church. Interment was in Fairview Cemetery. ### Stonemason, 82, J. T. Lambert Dies

John Thomas Lambert, veteran Guelpin stonemason and a resident of the city for more than 50 years, died in St. Joseph's Hospital on Tuesday, November 4 in his 82nd year.

Born and educated in Erin Township, Mr. Lambert was the son of Mr. and Mrs. R. M. Lambert. He moved to Guelpin in 1896 and had resided here ever since. A stonemason and bricklayer by trade, he was for several years the city building inspector.

Surviving are his wife, the former Ada Wille Robertson, and four sons, William R., of Brantford, J. Thomas of Kincardine, J. Harold, Guelpin, and Dr. Robert S., of Willoughby, Ohio. One son, Roy L., was killed in a motor accident near St. Thomas in 1946. Also surviving are four daughters, Mrs. Robert L. Craig and Mrs. Stanley G. Craig, both of Guelpin, Mrs. Malcolm H. Reed, of Hamilton and Mrs. Herbert Hallman of Kitchener. There are 15 grandchildren and three great grandchildren. He leaves two sisters, Mrs. Robert Dron, of Georgetown, and Mrs. James Fortes, of London; and three brothers, Lorne, of Toronto, Howard, of Acton, and Herbert of Guelpin.
