HALTON EXHIBITORS PROMINENT AT ROYAL

The 1952 Royal is an event of the past. As we intimated in our column last week, Halton exhibitors would give an outstanding account of themselves, and they did. We cannot hope to cover all of the winnings of all Halton exhibitors, but here are a few of the highlights which came to our attention.

Jersey Show

Every province in Canada with the exception of Newfoundland was represented in this great show which in our opinion was the finest Jersey show it has ever been our privilege to witness. No less than 64 breeders made entries and the prizes were well distributed with one breeder dominating the show. Ken Ella of Hornby, and M. C. Beatty of Milton R.R. No. 4, each had a red ribbon.

In the case of the Ella herd this was on their senior yearling heifer in milk. In addition Rick Ella Jerseys also brought home a fourth and ninth which in classes ranging up to 30 or more head, is no mean achievement. Beatty's Lindale herd also had two-fourths, two-fifths, and an eighth in addition to the red ribbon their winning three year old in milk.

Featherstone Bros. Avonlea herd had a third, a fourth, a fifth and a sixth. Gerald Graham of Georgetown, had fourth on his great senior calf; and eighth on his three year old herd sire. The fact that this animal was grand champion male at the Halton Show last September, and reserve grand at the Western Ontario championship show at Simcoe, will give some idea of the quality of this great show.

Sale of Stars (Jerseys)

\$1070 was the average of the animals sold in this great sale. Prominent American Jersey breeders present stated that were it not for the present embargo the average figure realized would have been doubled. This again is another indication of the high quality of both the sale and the show.

Gerald Graham's 4th prize senior calf, namely Graham Farm Gold-beam Carrance, brought \$600. Featherstone Bros. 5th prize three year old in milk, Avonlea Basil's Pinn Pet brought \$1,000; while Maurice Beatty's Lindale Basil Princess the winner in this class was knocked down at \$3,000.

It will be recalled that Princess is classified "excellent" in her own right and was the grand champion female not only at the Halton show but also at the Western Ontario Championship Show. From the herd, Lindale Basil Rosebay also classified "excellent", brought \$2,000.

Guernsey Show

Four of Halton Guernsey breeders also competed in a strong show. Joyce Bros. contingent brought back one second, two-thirds, one-fifth and two-sixths. M. T. McLaughlin and Sons of Georgetown won two thirds, one fourth, a fifth, one eighth

and a tenth. J. L. Chisholm had five fourths, one sixth, one eighth and a ninth, while Wm. G. Booth had a third, a fourth and a sixth.

Halesia Show

A. G. Hunter and J. J. Pellerin's brood were the only Halton representatives in the Black and White show, but needless to add they were worthy representatives. In the senior yearling bull class, A. G. Hunter had second on Hunterholm R. A. Supreme. This animal later was declared reserve junior champion male. Hunterholm also had fourth on his aged dry cow; sixth on a senior heifer calf, while Asaville Farms had as we recall fourth on their outstanding milking three year old, and fifth on their progeny.

Tamworth Swine

In this strong show, Halton was represented by a great list of entries from the herd of T. J. Brownridge and Son of Georgetown. When we passed by they had already won four firsts in addition to quite a number of seconds, fourths and fifths. In addition, they had both the grand champion and the reserve grand champion boars and the champion sow.

Hampshire Sheep

Down in the sheep barn we found the entries of J. H. Willmott and Son. While not quite as prominent as normally they nevertheless won their share with three seconds, one third, two fifths and a sixth.

Shorthorns

Unfortunately, we didn't see much of this great show but we did learn that Grant Campbell had the Junior Champion Male on his winning junior bull calf. Unfortunately for your reporter judging was still in progress when we had to leave. Scotsdale, Campbell, Merry Brook, and Amolea all had some top quality individuals in their respective line-ups, and needless to add we are confident they would get at least their share of the top awards.

Queen's Guineas

Thursday afternoon of last week saw the judging of this popular event. Standing room was at a premium around the big ring in the Coliseum when the 85 club members parade their baby beeves. Charlie Yule, noted judge, of Calgary, had his work cut out with 42 entries in the Shorthorn section, 38 in the Aberdeen Angus, and 15 in Herefords. Highest Deposits Ever For B of M

Reflecting the swift rate of Canada's industrial growth, the Bank of Montreal's 135th annual statement, just published, features record figures for deposits, loans and total resources. Most notable of these are deposits of \$2,147,000,000—the highest total in the B of M's long history. These deposits comprise the funds of more than 1,000,000 customers from coast to coast.

"Fully half these deposits are made up of the savings of private citizens," was the comment which Gordon A. Odeh, the local branch manager, made in a message issued to-day by the B of M, in reviewing for its customers the highlights of its annual statement.

The report, which is for the year ended October 31, shows an increase in loans of \$65,811,000 over the 1951 figure. This brings total loans up to the highest record in the bank's history—\$712,170,846. These loans, the message from the manager states, were made "... in business and industrial enterprises for production of every kind—to farmers, fishermen, oil men, miners, lumbermen and ranchers—to citizens of every calling, and to provincial and municipal governments and school districts."
