## Yes, No Bananas For Awhile Yet

Canadians won't be growing bananas instead of wheat for some time to come, replies to a recent Financial Post "Quest" suggest. But that doesn't mean a higher mean temperature, as some scientists predict, wouldn't give Canada an economic and social boost.
