THE MIXING BOWL

Hello Homemakers! It's a real treasure to give a party for children because they are so enthusiastic about even the most simple things. Christmas is such an exciting season that parties practically run themselves after they get started for that is where the secret lies. Provide a play section, green boughs and paper ribbon, then let the children help to place the greenery and the ribbons on backs of chairs or door knobs. In the first instance the child or children may call or speak to their friends on the phone and invite them to the party. This will create a feeling of responsibility and importance which will not be amiss when the time comes to act as host or hostess.

In one corner of the room have a tree with a little silver tinsel near the top and the candy canes tied on it. The children will add more decorations later which is something for them to do until everyone arrives. After you divide the group into two teams and suggest a few games a leader may take over.

TAKE A TIP

- Games for parties.
1. Snowball Fight. Give each a piece of cleansing tissue and with their toes on a line, everyone throws as far as they can.
 2. Pinning a Star. Draw a 4-foot Christmas tree on an oblong piece of cardboard and pin it against a curtain. Each player is blindfolded in turn and given a paper star. He is then turned around twice and told to pin the star on the tree where he first touches it.
 3. On the track. Tack white tape the length of the room. Each person in turn is given a pair of binoculars through which they must look as they walk with their toes on the tape.
 4. Memory test. Place 25 articles on a large tray such as a button, star, belt, glass, key, scissors, match box and pencil. Carry it around the room 5 times then ask

everyone to write a list of everything. This sounds easier than it is.

3. Christmas Carols. No Christmas party would be complete without carols. For variation have the girls sing one verse and the boys another. You may return to the party in time to coach them on two-part harmony.

Cheese Burgers
Split hamburger rolls. On one side place a slice of cream or old cheese and dot with pieces of bacon. Place rolls on broiling pan with tops, cut-side-up alongside each. Broil about 2 inches from hot top oven element for 3 to 5 minutes. Butter tops and place on cheese and bacon. Serve warm.

Cherry Custard Cream
2 eggs, separated
1/2 cup icing sugar
1 1/2 cups thick cream
1/4 tsp. cherry juice
1/2 cup cut maraschinos

Beat egg whites and set aside. Beat egg yolks and blend in icing sugar and 1/4 cup cream. Cook egg mixture in double boiler until slightly thickened. Chill. Add cherry juice. Beat 1 cup of cream until stiff; fold cream, cherries and egg whites into custard. Freeze in refrigerator.

THE QUESTION BOX
Mrs. C. D. asks: Why is pie crust crumbly when made with the wire blender?

Answer: Too much shortening is the usual cause. You may also find that improved brands have more shortening value.

Mrs. E. P. asks: For a Cheese Pie recipe.

Answer:

Cheese Pie
Prepare a crumb crust and line an 8 x 8 inch cake pan or a sponge cake pan. Press crust on bottom and sides. Reserve 1/2 cup of the mix. Chill it well. For Filling: Dissolve 1 cup granulated sugar in 1/2 cup cream. Add 2 lbs. (2 pints) creamy cottage cheese, 4 beaten eggs, 3 tbsps. flour, 2 tbsps. lemon juice, grated rind of lemon, 1/2 tsp. salt. Fill the shell, sprinkle with halved maraschino cherries and reserved crumbs. Bake at 250 degrees for about 1 hour. Let stand 2 or 3 hours before cutting in squares or sections.

Born at Erin, 1875 Ayer Resident Dies

Mrs. John Gillies (nee, Ellen Maria Grant) of Ayer, died November 12, at Galt General Hospital, following an illness of 16 days. She was born August 20, 1875, at Erin, Ontario, a daughter of William Grant, whose birth during 1826 in eastern Ontario was of United Empire Loyalist parents. She was married on October 18, 1894, at St. Mary's to Charles W. Taylor, who died as the result of an accident in 1896. She was re-married March 25, 1919, to John Gillies of South Dumfries who lived in that township until his death nine years ago. Since 1913 Mrs. Gillies had resided in Ayer. She is survived by one son, Wm. A. Taylor, of London; one sister, Martha A. Wheeler, of Toronto, and the following stepdaughters and stepsons: Mrs. Florence Walker, Arden, Manitoba; Mrs. S. B. Chapple, Teeswater, Ont.; and J. Stanley Taylor, of Hillsdale Beach, Manitoba.

The funeral service was conducted by Rev. W. D. Goodger at Knox United Church, Ayer, and interment was made in the Ayer Cemetery.
