## MORE ATTRACTIVE FARMSTEADS, BEAUTIFICATION IS FORUM TOPIC

As you drive along the country road, you look at the farm homes you pass and form your impressions of the people from what you see. Just as you look at other people's homes, so they look at yours, and judge you as a farmer by the appearance of your home.

Therefore the first question forums were called upon to discuss on this topic was "How important is the appearance of the farmstead?" Forums report it is very important as it denotes character and cleanliness and tends to keep up the morale of the occupants as well as the passing public. It adds value to the property, as well as creating a better market for the sale of farm products to those seeking farm products such as cattle, seed grain and potatoes.

Not less than 75 per cent. of the value of the farm is based on the general appearance of the farmstead. First impressions are lasting impressions, like any well groomed subject, admired and liked.

The second question in part (a) Can you suggest farm home improvements that can be made with little cash outlay? Not much cash outlay is required for cleaning up the weeds, painting, ploughing up old lawns, reseeding, planting trees ordered from the Department of Lands and Forests, keeping fences in good repair, planting flowers and shrubs in suitable localities, and keeping implements all under cover when not in use. Placing the owner's name at the roadside where it can be seen was another improvement suggested by Halton forums.

"How can the costly improvements be fitted into the farm budget?" was another part of question
