Mr. Duncan Hurren is renewing acquaintances in this district. It being his first return from the west where he went 41 years ago.

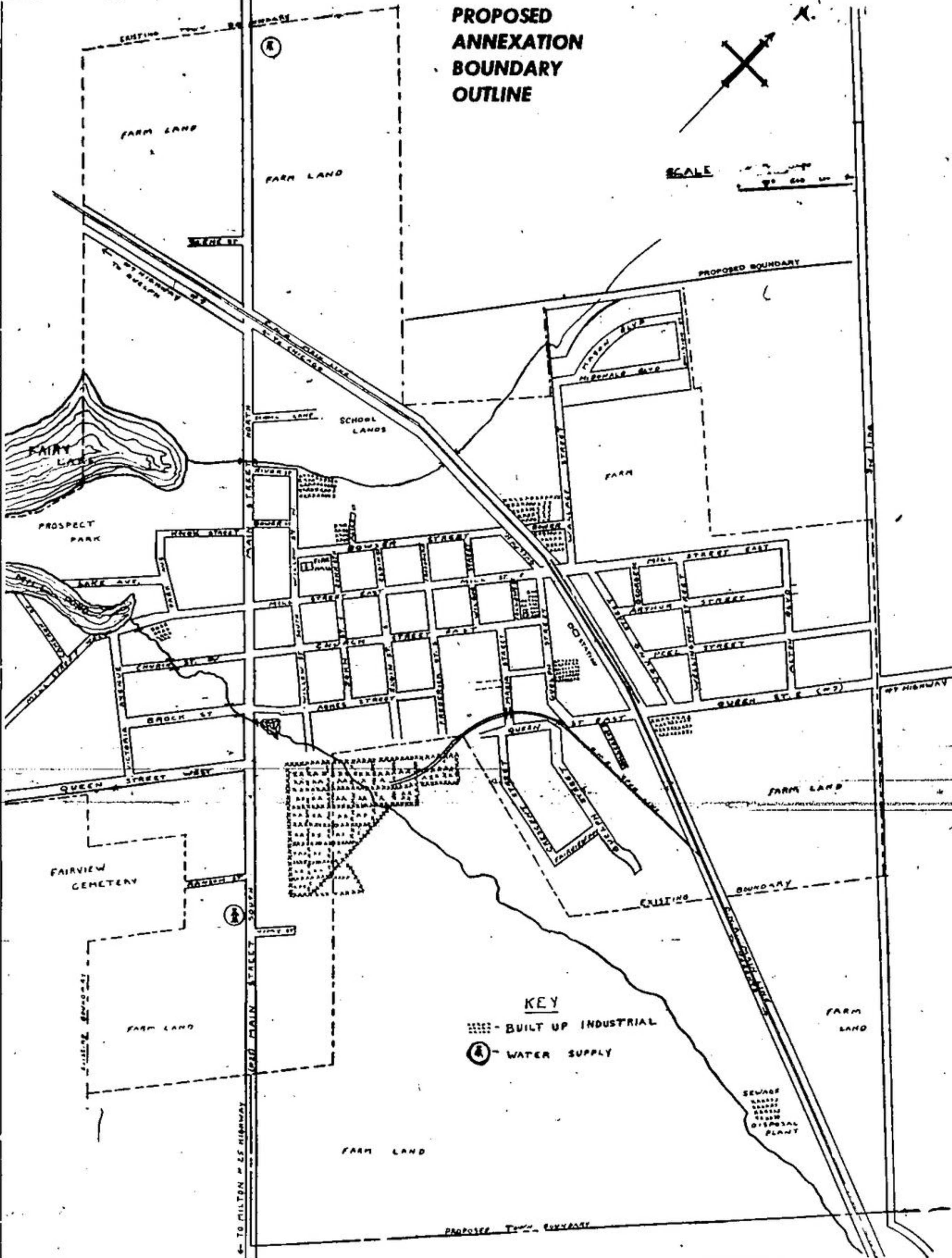
Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Dearing and Murray returned home after spending a week with relatives in Detroit.
