

MANY EXPRESS CONGRATULATIONS AT 50th ANNIVERSARY OF W.I.

Mrs. A. T. Brown, one of the earliest workers of the Acton Women's Institute when it was formed by Acton exactly half a century ago, cut the three-layer decorated cake marking the 50th anniversary of the group in Acton United church on Tuesday. About 140 ladies from Acton and district, representatives from Halton and Wellington counties, as well as some from Toronto, Guelph and Stayner, gathered in the church to mark the event with an afternoon program and tea.

A basket of golden flowers and a bouquet of roses were at the front of the church auditorium when the ladies opened the program with the Institute Ode and National Anthem. Rev. E. A. Curry welcomed them on behalf of the church and gave the opening prayer.

A parade of old-fashioned costumes recalled early days in the district. Several ladies from Dublin and Bannockburn-W. I. displayed interesting old gowns as the judges, Mrs. A. J. Buchanan, Mrs. F. G. Oakes and Mrs. Garmel McKenzie, selected winners. The first prize, a gold teapot, was awarded to Mrs. Walter Linham; the second prize, a cup and saucer, to Mrs. G. Storey, both of Bannockburn W.I. and the third prize to little Miss Lorna McPherson, who wore an old-time, long child's dress. Mrs. Storey's dress, about 90 years old, had been worn by Mrs. Fred Anderson's mother and grandmother on their wedding days.

F. G. Oakes, the wife of Acton's mayor, brought congratulations from the town and Mrs. Clarence Hayes of Georgetown from the home economics department of the W.I. Further congratulations were expressed from Women's Institutes of Georgetown, Dublin, Bannockburn, Palermo, Scotch Block, Mountain Union, Campbellville, Nassagaweya, Buay Beas, Ballinfad, Silverwood and Linthouse in Halton and Greenock, Royal of Guelph and South Wellington of Wellington county.

Mrs. William Hamilton, a member for many years in Erinosa and now an Acton member, concluded by thanking everyone graciously and "Auld Lang Syne" was sung.

The ladies adjourned to the Sunday school room, where the three-tiered birthday cake centred the tea table, flanked by gold candles and African violets. The cake was baked by Mrs. Anderson and led by Mrs. J. F. Wilds, a former president. Inscribed on it was "Acton W.I. 50th Anniversary," and a small vase on the top held blue and gold flowers. Mrs. A. T. Brown cut the cake. Pouring tea were Mrs. George Agnew of Toronto, a member of Acton W.I. for many years and former county president and Mrs. W. Brill of Georgetown, a former president.

The luncheon committee convenor was Mrs. Earl Lambert, with Mrs. F. Hunter, Mrs. W. Denny, Mrs. C. Mason, Mrs. E. Smith, and Mrs. McAulay, other members also assisting to serve the delicious refreshments.
