Comparative results of three years' investigations at the Forest Nursery Station, Indian Head, Sask, indicated that proper mulching of trees may be a satisfactory method of establishing windbreaks, spaced 4 x 4 feet, under certain prairie

conditions. Data obtained during the growing seasons of 1949, 1950 and 1951 indicated that mulching of trees grown since 1942 at the Station, in belts 4 x 4 feet, tended to increase the water content of twigs. This would increase their possibility of escaping drought injury. 
