This one goes back to January 7th, 1901, and the arches and banners and welcome signs along Mill "Street were to welcome home Gunner W. J. Gould from the War in South Africa. Acton sent two of its sons to that war, Stanley Moore and Billy Gould. Stanley Moore was buried in South Africa and Billy came home and lived to serve again in the first World War.


