BLOOD NEEDS

One of the heaviest responsibilities delegated to Canadian Red Cross by the nation is meeting the whole blood requirements of Military and Veterans Hospitals in Canada, and a growing commitment for Armed Forces and Civil Defence. These commitments are in addition to the whole blood and plasma requirements of 550 civilian hospitals in Canada. In 1952, 321,030 bottles of blood were collected from volunteer donors. 136,594 patients received blood transfusions.

A splendid way to stimulate your youngsters' enthusiasm for their studies is to specially plan weekend trips.

During the first week of school visit the teacher and discuss the term's subject matter. Then, gather the family around a road map to discover where, within a 200-mile radius of your town, you can find a museum, an event, a site, an exhibition, an industry, or any activity that ties in with the children's forthcoming studies in geography, nature, current events, or history. And finally, plan a weekend itinerary to include visits to several of these places.

First, because Fall weather is usually still warm enough for swimming, picnics, and outdoor sports, which should be included in the plans. Secondly, because the whole project can be a game. Their older children play memory games with the parents to remember names of insects or birds they see or the dates and incidents in connection with some historical sightseeing goal.

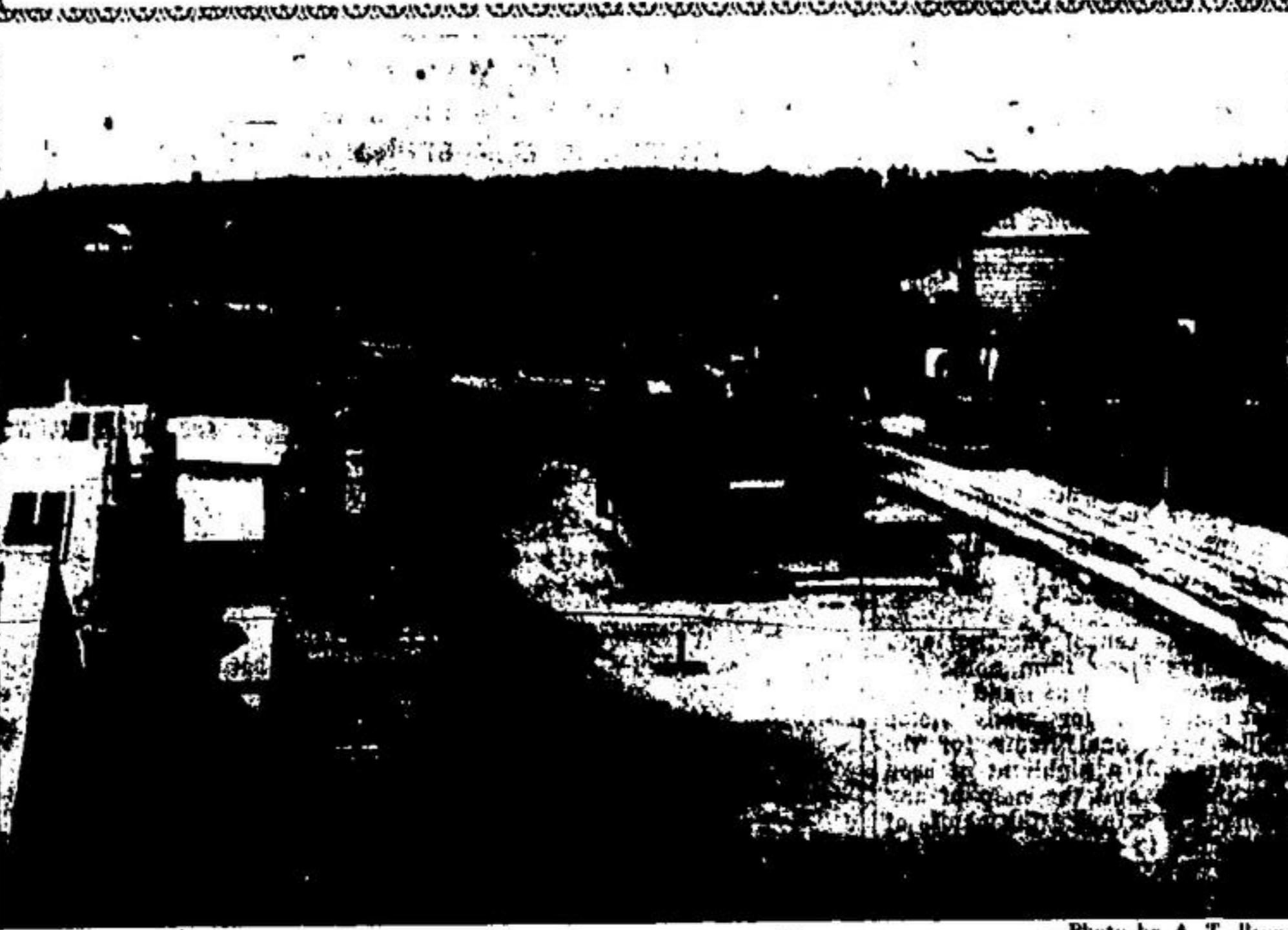

TALES ON TINTYPES

This picture of the Grand Trunk Station and yards is not dated in the records of the photos taken by Mr. A. T. Brown, but from our own recollections we would judge it was a scene well over 40 years old. If you look closely, you will notice the horse-drawn dray that used to deliver the express and freight shipments to the merchants. The station is, of course, the same building that served the rail-travelling public of to-day.

The building now owned by Mason Knitting Co. will be noted at the left and in the distance is the Wallace home and away across the fields on the horizon can be seen the barn on the farm now owned by Reeve J. J. Stewart. Of course, the water tank that supplied the railway engines has gone and the locomotives no longer take on water at Acton.

All the land now occupied by

Micro Plastics, Blow Machine Shops and A. P. Green Fire Brick Co. was vacant property and was farm land. To the left can be seen a portion of "Warren Grove" back of the barn that still stands and is owned by Tony Seynuck. The little rough-cast house just near the water tank was likely occupied at that time by the Hornbys.

It's more than likely the photograph was taken from the top of the grain elevator that stood along the siding and was owned by Robert Noble. It was a tall metal clad structure which was quite a landmark until destroyed by fire over 20 years ago and was ranged second to Cobble Hill for getting a scenic view of Acton and the district. The station at that time bore the name of Acton West. The pump that drew the water from the well for drinking purposes can be seen in the foreground.

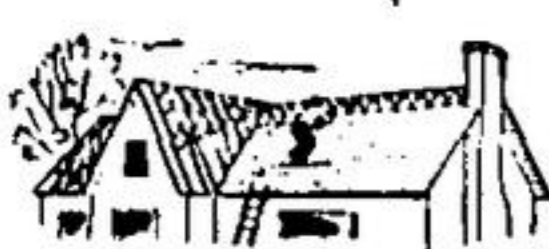
