

**P.U.C. Discusses New Type of Truck**

Mr. Agnew of Smith Engineering was present at the Acton P.U.C. meeting last Thursday evening to discuss with the Commission the type of truck needed for the hydro department. He outlined what size of truck and the equipment necessary for efficient handling of flowwork and other work carried on by the department.

A letter was read from the council asking that the property where the old workshop was situated be cleaned up. Supt. Mason reported that this work had been promised done by an official of Baxter Laboratories who now own the land and so he had not proceeded with the work.

Superintendent Lambert reported on the hydrant which, according to the present survey, is on J. Higgins' property on Mason Blvd. The main is too close to the line, right under where a sidewalk would be placed, to allow for the connection. The main had been uncovered and filled in until such time as council decides where to place the hydrant. While the hole had been open, Deputy-reeve Thompson, chairman of streets and walks, and chairman R. MacArthur, had viewed the main and connections.

The secretary, J. McGeachie, was instructed to take all necessary steps to collect an account, even to court action. Superintendent Lambert reported that at the present time the heat exchanger was running 16 hours daily on sewer gas when the digester tank is half full of sludge. Plans have been made to move the fire hydrant on Education Lane, opposite the high school from the road side of the sidewalk to the other side, so that vehicles will have more clearance while travelling on this roadway.

Superintendent Lambert reported that the tapping machine for use on the water main was in need of repairs to a total of over \$100. A new machine, it is expected, will cost \$200. The present machine has been in operation for 30 years and when an installation was underway recently, would not work. Through the offices of the Georgetown superintendent, the machine from that town had been used in Acton. It was decided to purchase a new machine.

Plans were made for ditching, tiling and repairing the road going down the hill to the spring pump house. At the present time, it is not safe to drive a vehicle down this hill. An estimate was prepared, as requested by council of the cost of work yet to be done at the sewage disposal plant, so that they could formulate plans to proceed with the work. A considerable sum is yet needed to bring the plant and grounds up to the necessary standard and to protect the work already done at this location.

The wire and fixtures have been ordered for an alarm system for the sewage plant so Superintendent Lambert will know when there is a power interruption at the plant. Superintendent Mason reported on changes made in the vicinity of Bower and John Streets to relieve transformers which were overloaded.

The district supervisor has asked the Acton commission to make heavier wire on Church St. for three blocks, to relieve the heavy load on No. 2 substation, and to transfer the Wood Community lead to No. 1 substation.

Secretary McGeachie brought up the matter of a meter-supplying billing machine which can be used for tax billing and various other work besides the regular hydro and water accounts. The cost of these machines is \$4000.
